## Tips to Help Children Succeed in the Classroom

### In the evenings:

- Help your child(ren) get to bed on time. A well-rested student does better.
- Help children resolve disagreements before going to bed.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AT BOARD MEETINGS:** The Board of Education recognizes the value to school governance of public comment on educational issues and the importance of allowing members of the public to express themselves on school matters of community interest. The Board offers public participation to members of the public in accordance with the procedures below. The Board applies these procedures to all speakers and does not discriminate based on the identity of the speaker, content of the speech, or viewpoint of the speaker.

The Board is also committed to conducting its meetings in a productive and efficient manner that assures that the regular agenda of the Board is completed in a reasonable period of time, honors the voluntary nature of the Board's time and using that time efficiently, and allows for a fair and adequate opportunity for input to be considered. Consequently, public participation at Board meetings will be governed by this bylaw.

In order to permit the fair and orderly expression of such comment, the Board shall provide a period for public participation at every regular meeting of the Board and publish rules to govern such participation in Board meetings.

The presiding officer of each Board meeting at which public participation is permitted shall administer the rules of the Board for its conduct.

The presiding officer shall be guided by the following rules:

- Public participation shall be permitted as indicated on the order of business.
- Participants must be recognized by the presiding officer and will be requested to preface their comments by an announcement of their name, address, and group affiliation, if and when appropriate.
- Each statement made by a participant shall be limited to three (3) minutes duration unless extended by the presiding officer.
- No participant may speak more than once on the same topic unless all others who wish to speak on that topic have been heard.
- All statements shall be directed to the presiding officer; no person may address or question Board members individually.
- Audio or video recordings are permitted. The person operating the recorder should contact the Superintendent prior to the Board meeting to review possible placement of the equipment, and must agree to abide by the following conditions:
  - No obstructions are created between the Board and the audience. No interviews are conducted in the meeting room while the Board is in session. No commentary, adjustment of equipment, or positioning of operators is made that would distract either the Board or members of the audience while the Board is in session and not disrupt the meeting.

The presiding officer may:

- prohibit public comments that are frivolous, repetitive, and/or harassing;
- interrupt, warn, or terminate a participant's statement when the statement is too lengthy, abusive, off-topic, obscene, or irrelevant;
- request any individual to leave the meeting when that person does not observe reasonable decorum or is disruptive to the conduct of the meeting;
- request the assistance of law enforcement officers in the removal of a disorderly person when that person's conduct interferes with the orderly progress of the meeting;
- call for a recess or an adjournment to another time when the lack of public decorum so interferes with the orderly conduct of the meeting as to warrant such action;
- waive these rules with the approval of the Board when necessary for the protection of privacy or the administration of the Board's business

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## STUDENT DISCIPLINE CODE

Respect for law and for those persons in authority shall be expected of all students. This includes conformity to school rules as well as general provisions of law affecting students. Respect for the rights of others, consideration of their privileges, and cooperative citizenship shall also be expected of all members of the school community. The Board of Education has zero tolerance of violent, disruptive, or inappropriate behavior by its students. Respect for real and personal property; pride in one's work; achievement within the range of one's ability; and exemplary personal standards of courtesy, decency, and honesty shall be maintained in the schools of this District.

The Board of Education recognizes the rights of students as individuals and therefore seeks to balance and protect those rights by establishing the rules and regulations necessary to create a suitable curricular climate as well as a suitable co-curricular climate.

Students in the Canton City School District have the responsibility to act in such a way as not to interfere with the right of others to the same educational opportunity. By accepting the right to participate in school programs on or off school property, the students shall also accept the responsibility to conduct themselves according to the rules, regulations, and provisions governing the operation of these programs.

Each of the behaviors and/or types of misconduct described below are prohibited and may subject the student to disciplinary action including, but not limited to, student conference, parent/guardian notification, parent/guardian conference, detention, in-school discipline, suspension and/or expulsion from school. Furthermore, any criminal acts committed at or related to the School will be reported to law enforcement officials as well as disciplined at school. Certain criminal acts may result in permanent exclusion from school.

**Acceptable Use of Technology Violation** -The use of technology for any purpose that violates the student code of conduct, board policies, rules or regulations regarding the use of technology in the district, building or classroom or any use which is outside the educational purpose is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Theft, destruction of property
- Purchasing goods or services
- Bullying
- Interfering with the normal functioning of computers, systems or networks
- Accessing, modifying or deleting files/data that do not belong to you
- Giving username or password to any other student or using the username or password of anyone else to access any part of the system
- Viewing, transmitting or downloading pornographic, obscene, vulgar and/or indecent materials
- Sending or publishing offensive or harassing messages/content
- Accessing dangerous information, that if acted upon, could cause damage or danger to others
- Violating copyright laws and/or district policy on plagiarism
- Recreational/non-educational use of electronic communication
- Hacking and/or other illegal activities in an attempt to gain unauthorized access to restricted files or other computer/systems
- Saving inappropriate files to any part of the system
- Any file which is not needed for school purposes or a class assignment
- Failure to report any acceptable use violation
- Any unauthorized use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) or Natural Language Processing (NLP) tools to complete any school assignment
- \*\*Use of district technology resources is a privilege and not a right. Unauthorized and inappropriate use will result in loss of this privilege and/or other disciplinary action.

**Aiding or Abetting** - Being an accessory to (e.g. assisting, planning, participating, and/or encouraging) any violation of school rules.

**Assault Against Another Student** - An intentional physical attack of another student

**Assault Against Another Student with Serious Bodily Injury** - A physical attack on another student with/without a weapon that inflicts serious bodily injury. Serious bodily injury is defined as "a bodily injury that involves substantial risk of death; extreme physical pain; protracted and obvious disfigurement; or protracted loss or impairment of the function of a bodily member, organ, or faculty" 18 U.S.C. 1365(h)(3)

**Assault against Staff** - An intentional physical attack of a staff member

**Assault Against Staff with Serious Bodily Injury** - A physical attack on a staff member with/without a weapon that inflicts serious bodily injury. Serious bodily injury is defined as "a bodily injury that involves substantial risk of death; extreme physical pain; protracted and obvious disfigurement; or protracted loss or impairment of the function of a bodily member, organ, or faculty" 18 U.S.C. 1365(h)(3)

**Blackmail** - Demanding payment/another benefit from someone in return for not revealing compromising or damaging information about them.

**Bullying/Harassment/Intimidation/Cyberbullying Based on Disability** - Any intentional written, graphic, verbal, or physical act that a student has exhibited toward another student, based on disability, more than once, such that the behavior both causes mental or physical harm to another student and is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for the other student. Therefore, the outcome of the conduct need only unreasonably interfere with a student's access to education or create an intimidating or hostile educational environment based upon the degree to which the conduct affected one or more students' education: the nature, scope, frequency, duration, and location of an incident or incidents: the identity, number, and relationship of the person involved.

**Bullying/Harassment/Intimidation/Cyberbullying Based on Race, Color, or National Origin** -

Any intentional written, graphic, verbal, or physical act that a student has exhibited toward another student, based on race, color, or national origin, more than once, such that the behavior both causes mental or physical harm

to another student and is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for the other student. Therefore, the outcome of the conduct need only unreasonably interfere with a student's access to education or create an intimidating or hostile educational environment based upon the degree to which the conduct affected one or more students' education: the nature, scope, frequency, duration, and location of an incident or incidents: the identity, number, and relationship of the person involved

**Bullying/Harassment/Intimidation/Cyberbullying Based on Sex or Sexual Orientation** - Any intentional written, graphic, verbal, or physical act that a student has exhibited toward another student, based on sexual characteristics, more than once, such that the behavior both causes mental or physical harm to another student and is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for the other student. Therefore, the outcome of the conduct need only unreasonably interfere with a student's access to education or create an intimidating or hostile educational environment based upon the degree to which the conduct affected one or more students' education: the nature, scope, frequency, duration, and location of an incident or incidents: the identity, number, and relationship of the person involved.

**Bullying/Harassment/Intimidation/Cyberbullying Based on Something Other than Sex, Race, Color, National Origin or Disability** - Any intentional written, graphic, verbal, or physical act that a student has exhibited toward another student, based on something other than sex, race, color, national origin, or disability, more than once, such that the behavior both causes mental or physical harm to another student and is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for the other student. Therefore, the outcome of the conduct need only unreasonably interfere with a student's access to education or create an intimidating or hostile educational environment based upon the degree to which the conduct affected one or more students' education: the nature, scope, frequency, duration, and location of an incident or incidents: the identity, number, and relationship of the person involved

**Bus Conduct Violation** - Any behavior or action that distracts the bus driver, causes a dangerous situation, or disturbs the orderly operation of school transportation is considered inappropriate bus behavior. This includes behavior that occurs on any property owned or controlled by the district (i.e school transportation vehicle, bus stop) or at a school sponsored off CCSD grounds. Student must comply with the Ohio Department of Education regulations posted on the school vehicle and transportation website.

**Damage/Destruction of Property (Vandalism)** - Loss, destruction, defacement, or inappropriate use of any CCSD school property, textbooks, media center materials, computers/ipads, or computer/ipad related materials

**Disruptive Behavior** - Intentional acts, behaviors, or conduct that materially and substantially disrupts or interferes with school activities or the educational process, or which threatened to do so. This may include physical contact, such as hitting and/or horseplay that does not rise to the level of fighting or assault, and minor theft that does not rise to the level of Robber/Theft.

**Disruptive behavior through Social Media/Electronics** - Intentional acts, behaviors, or conduct initiated through social media/electronics that materially and substantially disrupts or interferes with school activities or the educational process, or which threatened to do so.

**Dress Code Violation** - All clothing garments shall be neat, clean, properly sized, and in an acceptable state of coverage. Students may not wear anything that promotes gangs, tobacco, alcohol, drug use, sexual activity, or an illegal or immoral act. Any fashion garment or accessory that disrupts the educational process or prevents a safety risk will not be considered permissible attire  
\*\*Student violations of the dress code can result in removal from class (until the violation can be resolved) and disciplinary action. Parents will be contacted to bring appropriate clothing for their student to change attire. (Board Policy 5511)

**Extortion** - Use of threat, intimidation, force or deception to take or receive something from someone else

**False Alarms/Bomb Threats** - Making a knowingly false statement regarding the possession or location of explosive materials. (e.g. reporting a fire when no fire exists, attempting to activate the fire alarm on school property or the bus, making false/inappropriate 911 calls)

**False Reports** - Reporting an incident, a crime, or information regarding a crime/incident with knowledge that the information is false inaccurate, or did not occur

**Fighting** - A physical altercation between two or more students (actions that do not represent reasonable self-defense). Fighting is the mutual participation in an incident involving physical violence.

**Forgery/Falsification** - Acts, including but not limited to, falsifying school records, forging/falsifying signatures, falsifying identification by representing as another in any form of communication, counterfeiting, bribery, and/or using an unauthorized computer ID or password.

**Foul Language Directed Toward Another (Profanity)** - Swearing, cursing, or other inappropriate language or gestures in school buildings, on school buses/vehicles, or on school grounds

**Gambling** - Betting money or items on card games, dice games, the outcome of games or activities, and/or possession of gambling materials or paraphernalia.

**Gangs** - Any act that initiates, advocates, or promotes gang activities which threaten the safety or well being of persons or which are disruptive to the school environment. This includes, but is not limited to: wearing, carrying or displaying gang paraphernalia exhibiting behavior or gestures which symbolize gang membership causing and/or participating in activities which intimidate or affect the attendance of another student initiations, hazing, intimidation and/or related activities of such group affiliations which are likely to cause bodily danger, physical harm, personal degradation or disgrace resulting in physical or mental harm

**Hazing** - Performing any act, or coercing another, including the victim, to perform any act of initiation into any class, team, or organization, that causes or creates a substantial risk of causing mental or physical harm. Permission, consent, or assumption of risk by an individual subjected to hazing shall not lessen the prohibitions contained in this rule. All incidents of hazing must be reported immediately to one or more of the following District personnel: the building principal or other administrator; teacher; coach; student club

**Inappropriate Displays of Affection** - Shared, mutual physical affection (fondling, rubbing, kissing, or other sexual conduct) on school grounds, at school-related activities, or on school transportation

**Inciting Others to Violence/Disruption** - The intentional incitement to engage another student in physical conflict and/or continuous harassment, or the promotion of misconduct for any purpose.

**Insubordination** - Refusing to comply with any reasonable request from school personnel or disobeying any general rule of the school including: not following directions of teachers, school administrators, or other staff members (e.g. failure to comply with a direction, not stopping an undesirable behavior, or remaining in an area when asked to leave). This does not include skipping a class.

**Insubordination: Refusing to Accept Discipline** - An intentional act by a student to avoid or find a way around an assigned disciplinary sanction, such as failure to serve a detention or complete other forms of discipline

**Loitering or Trespassing** - Refusing to leave any school property after being instructed to do so by school staff, law enforcement, or visiting/returning to school property during the instructional day without appropriate authorization

**Plagiarism/Academic Dishonesty** - Academic dishonesty includes, but is not limited to cheating on school assignments, plagiarism, and collusion. Cheating on a test includes copying from another student's test paper, using material during a test that is not authorized by the person giving the test, collaborating with another student during the test without authority, knowingly using, buying, selling, stealing, transporting, or soliciting, in whole or part, the contents of an unadministered test, substituting for another student, or permitting another student to substitute oneself to take a test, bribing, or paying another person to obtain a test in advance of the test. Plagiarism means presenting work or ideas from another source as your own, with or without consent of the original author, by incorporating it into your work without full acknowledgement/citation. Plagiarism includes the unauthorized use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) or Natural Language Processing (NLP) to complete any school assignment. Collusion means the unauthorized collaboration with another person in preparing written work for credit.

**Possession/Use/Sale/Distribution of a Firearm** - A firearm is any weapon which will, is designed to, or may readily be converted to expel a projectile by the action of an explosive; the frame or receiver of any such weapon; any firearm muffler or firearm silencer; or any machine gun. This includes zip guns, starter guns, and flare guns. Firearm look-a-likes should not be reported with this option.

**Possession/Use/Sale/Distribution of Drugs/Look-a-Like Drugs** - Possessing, carrying, carrying to sell, and/or concealing drugs or items that may be considered as look-alike drugs or substances represented to be drugs of the seller or distributor and/or thought to be drugs by the buyer or receiver. Attempting to sell or distribute any prescription and over-the-counter medicines, chemical substances, and all other legal substances. Drug-related paraphernalia includes, but is not limited to, pipes, clips, rolling papers, and other items used or related to drug use.

\*Students will not be permitted to carry or take any medication at school without proper documentation on file including over-the-counter medications

\*\*If a building principal has a reasonable individualized suspicion of drug or alcohol use, the student may request the student in question to submit to any appropriate testing, including but not limited to, a breathalyzer test or urinalysis. In such circumstances, the student will be taken to a private administrative or instructional area on school property for such testing with at least one other member of the teaching or administrative staff present as a witness to the test. If a student refuses to take the test, the student will be advised that such denial leaves the observed evidence of alcohol or drug use unrefuted thus leading to possible disciplinary action. The student will then be given a second opportunity to take the test.

**Possession/Use/Sale/Distribution of Tobacco** - Possessing, carrying, carrying to sell, concealing, consuming, or showing evidence of any nicotine-containing product on school grounds including cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, snuff, pipes, cigars, hookah, or electronic/vaping devices

**Rape or Attempted Rape** - Unlawful sexual intercourse (or attempt) or any other sexual penetration of the vagina, anus, or mouth of another person, with or without force, by a sex organ, other body part, or foreign object, without the consent of the person subjected to such penetration

**Robbery/Theft with a Weapon** - Using a weapon in the unlawful taking or disposition of another's property with the intent to deprive the person of the property, receiving stolen property, or attempted theft by deception, including public property, possession of stolen property, counterfeit items or missing items and/or possession of any federal, state, or district mandated test(s). Students are encouraged not to bring inappropriate non-instructional or valuable items or large sums of money to school. CCSD will not be liable for any lost, stolen, or damaged items brought to school.

**Robbery/Theft without a Weapon** - Unlawful taking or disposition of another's property with the intent to deprive the person of the property, receiving stolen property, or attempted theft by deception, including public property, possession of stolen property, counterfeit items or missing items and/or possession of any federal, state, or district mandated test(s). Students are encouraged not to bring inappropriate non-instructional or valuable items or large sums of money to school. CCSD will not be liable for any lost, stolen, or damaged items brought to school.

**Sexual Assault (other than rape)** - An act in which one intentionally sexually touches another person without that person's consent, or coerces or physically forces a person to engage in a sexual act against their will.

**Sexual Misbehavior** - Engagement in any sexual act toward an individual or group including, but not limited to, vulgar/obscene words or gestures, indecent exposure, possession of profane/vulgar/obscene/pornographic material, possession/distribution of derogatory/offensive poster(s), cards, pictures, cartoons, graffiti, or drawings on school property/buses or at school-sponsored events

**Skipping Class** - While present in school, student purposefully, and for no authorized reason, does not attend class  
Tardy - Failure to report on time, without an acceptable excuse, to school, classroom, or other instructional area.

**Threat of Physical Attack with a Weapon** - Any intentional communication or act with a weapon that threatens physical violence to another student, a student's family member or property.

**Threat of Physical Attack with a Weapon Against Staff** - Any intentional communication or act with a weapon that threatens physical violence to a staff member, a staff member's family or property.

**Threat of Physical Attack without a Weapon** - Any intentional communication or act without a weapon that threatens physical violence to another student, a student's family member or property.

**Threat of Physical Attack without a Weapon Against Staff** - Any intentional communication or act without a weapon that threatens physical violence to a staff member, a staff member's family or property.

**Truancy** - Persistent unexcused absences from class or school. A student choosing to skip two or more classes in a day or choosing to not attend school 2 or more days or leaving school grounds without permission at any point during the school day.

**Unwelcome Sexual Conduct** - Isolated, unwelcome sexual advances request for sexual favors, other physical or verbal conduct, or communication of a sexual nature, including gender-based harassment that creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive education or work environment (i.e. pinching, grabbing, suggestive comments, gestures or jokes, or pressure to engage in sexual activity).

**Verbal Disrespect of Staff** - Abusive language directed at a staff member, including profanity or insulting words or gestures that are harmful or offensive. This may include degrading a person based on race, ethnicity, national origin, gender, religion, age, or disability

**Violation of Safety Protocol** - Deliberate or purposeful deviation from district or school safety rules, procedures or instructions designed to maintain safety within any school environment. This includes, but is not limited to entering or leaving a building without permission in an area not designated for arrival/dismissal, opening a secured door for somebody to enter, pulling a fire alarm.

# STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is a significant student responsibility at all grade levels. Many studies correlate regular attendance with success in school. Regular attendance means that the academic learning process is not interrupted, less time is spent on make-up assignments, and students benefit from participation and interaction with others in class. Many important lessons are learned through active participation in classroom and other school activities that cannot be replaced by individual study.

When a parent, guardian, or other person having care of a student has failed to initiate a telephone call or other communication notifying the school or building administration of the student's excused or unexcused absence within 120 minutes after the beginning of the school day, the attendance officer or designee for each school building shall make at least one (1) attempt to contact the parent, guardian, or other person having care of any student who is recorded as absent without legitimate excuse within 120 minutes after the beginning of each school day by a method designated by the Superintendent in accordance with Ohio law (see AG 5200).

Establishing a pattern of good attendance will benefit the student in school and in the workplace. Attendance is important in the development of a high quality work ethic, which will be a significant factor in a student's success with future employers. One of the most important work habits that employers look for in hiring and promoting a person is his/her dependability in coming to work every day on time. This is a habit the School wants to help students develop as early as possible.

The educational program offered by this District is predicated upon the presence of the student and requires continuity of instruction and classroom participation. Attendance shall be required of all students enrolled in the schools during the days and hours that the school is in session or during the attendance sessions to which s/he has been assigned. A student in grades nine (9) through twelve (12) may be considered a full-time equivalent student provided the student is enrolled in at least five (5) units of instruction, as defined by State law, per school year.

The Canton City School District follows the legal guidance established through House Bill 410 through the State of Ohio. House Bill 410 provides a supportive and informative approach to increasing student attendance. House Bill 410 requires that parents/guardians are provided with timely notifications of absences and provides positive intervention(s) through the work of an Absence Intervention Team that will work with the family to create an Absence Intervention Plan. Absenteeism is identified and categorized as Chronic Absenteeism, Excessive Absences and Habitual Truancy. Please see the description of each below:

## Financial Summary

Listed below is a summary of the receipts and expenditures for the Canton City School District for the 2022-2023 fiscal year. The district accounts for numerous funds, most of them are restricted to a single purpose such as a student activity or a state or federal grant. During 2021-2022 the district took in **\$186,892,992** and expended **\$183,147,929**

Included in the total expenditures are \$1,503,081 for construction, \$1,305,234 for adult education, and \$1,188,547 for trust and agency funds. The average cost per pupil of \$16,236 does not include those expenditures.

The General Fund is the largest fund and accounts for most of the districts day to day operations.

### CODE OF CONDUCT

What is PBIS? PBIS is a school-wide preventative framework for maximizing the selection and use of evidence-based prevention and intervention practices along a multi-tiered continuum that supports the academic, social, emotional and behavioral competence of all students.

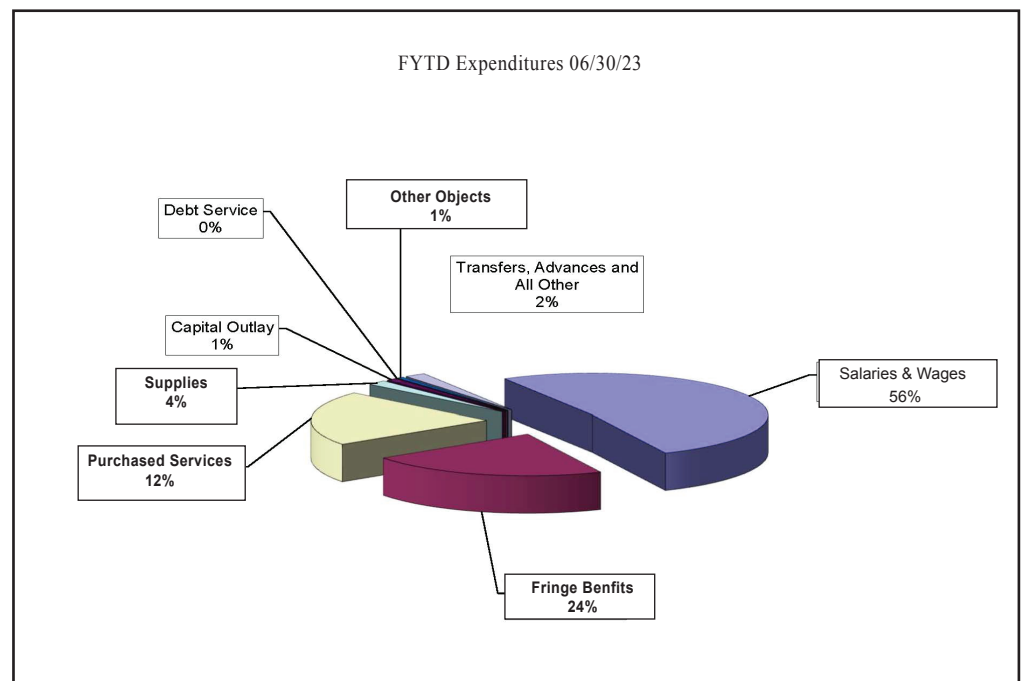
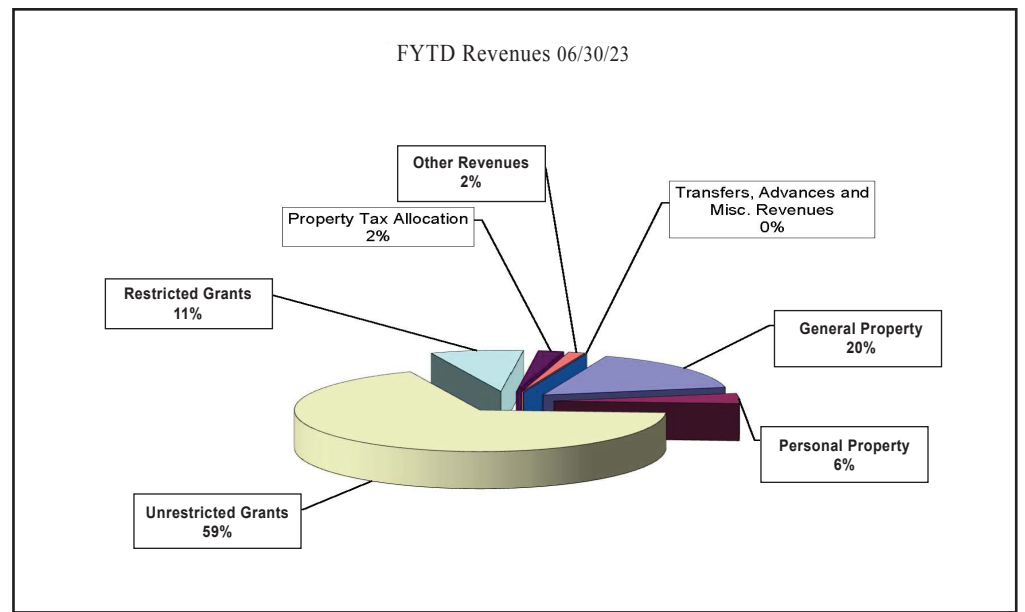
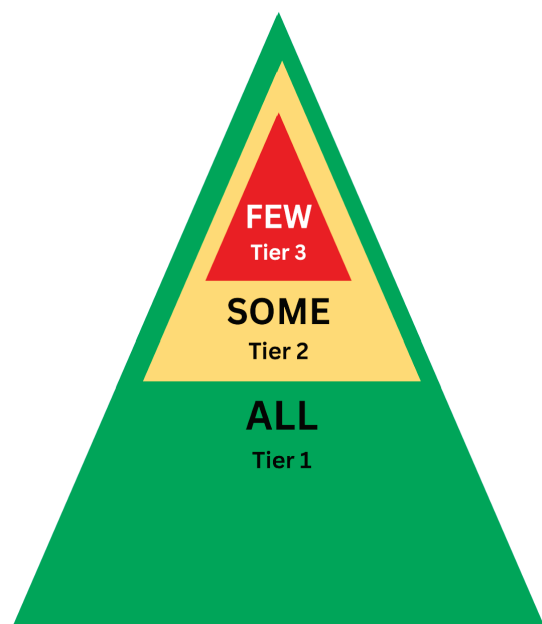

# Use of Electronic Communications Equipment by Students

## Education Purpose Statement

The District provides access to technology, including Internet access to enhance the instruction of its students and achieve the goals established by the District Board of Education and the Ohio Department of Education. This Agreement is established to promote the use of technology, including Internet access in a manner that leads to a safe and worthwhile educational experience for all. Therefore, the District is committed to providing teaching on Internet safety.

## Scope/Definitions

Technology, including the Internet, is a source of instructional material to which students and employees have access both inside and outside the boundaries of the school physical and temporal environment. This Agreement and the associated rules and regulations refer to all devices including but not limited to computers, smart phones, digital tablets, electronic computing communication, recording or imaging devices including but not limited to MP3 players, portable memory storage devices, calculators with interfacing capability, cell phones and digital cameras as well as technology infrastructure, associated peripheral devices and software:

- Owned by, leased by or on loan to the District or any third party engaged in providing services for the District.
- Any computing or telecommunication device owned by, in the possession of or being used by district students that are operated on the grounds of any district facility, off grounds at a school sponsored function or connected to any equipment at any district facility by means of direct connection, telephone line or other common carrier or any type of connection including both hardwired, fiber, Virtual Private Network (VPN), infrared and/or wireless.

This Agreement applies to any online service provided directly or indirectly by the District for student use. Examples of online services include but are not limited to electronic mail, web sites, cloud based computing applications and social media sites. Students agree to abide by any license agreement established with a third party. This Agreement is in effect for any school sponsored activity at any time or any place.

The Internet can be accessed by a variety of electronic devices including those not provided by the District. Because the material available on the Internet varies in quality and appropriateness and instructional material obtained from the Internet may have not been selected ahead of time in a manner similar to the way other instructional material is selected such as textbooks, software, or library books, the District cannot guarantee accuracy, appropriateness and opinions expressed in the materials.

Any implementation of the use of student-owned devices for instructional use must follow all district rules and policies and may require a separate signed approval by parent or guardian.

## Statement of Procedures

In order to maintain and encourage appropriate and effective use of Internet access, computer technology and connectivity, a set of rules for computer and network use have been established. Students must read and abide by these rules established by the District and their respective buildings and classrooms.

The District provides technology and Internet access in a good faith attempt to promote the safe, ethical, responsible, and legal use of this instructional resource. This access is intended to promote the effective use of technology and the Internet for educational purposes, protect students against potential dangers and ensure accountability. This access is not intended to function as a public access service or a public forum. The District reserves the right to restrict this access to ensure that its use is in accord with its educational purpose.

The District prohibits student-teacher interaction on social networking sites unless such interaction is specifically educational in nature. Any digital communication between district employees and students is expected to follow all district policies and the Ohio State Board of Education's Licensure Code of Professional Conduct for Ohio Educators.

Internet safety issues may arise around the access to and use of the Internet, internet-ready, and other electronic devices in a manner that promotes safe, civil and legal online activity for children, digital citizenship and literacy and recognizing and responding to cyberbullying. The District will offer training in the use of the Internet and students are required to participate in training. The training will address appropriate online behavior, cyber bullying awareness and response as well as proper etiquette when interacting with other individuals in social networking sites and chat rooms. Training relating to online safety issues may be made available for parents and guardians.

Student activities will be structured in a manner that is appropriate to the age and skill level of students. This approach is adopted in recognition of the importance of providing more secure environments for younger students and supporting safe, responsible and independent use by older students.

## Disclaimers/Hold Harmless Clause

The District makes no warranties of any kind, expressed or implied, in connection with its provision of access to the Internet or online services, technology or technology infrastructure provided to its students, staff or visitors. The District is not responsible for any personal documents or information stored on district technology or associated services nor is it responsible for any harm from the release of confidential information. The District will not be responsible for any damage users may suffer, including but not limited to loss of data, interruptions of service, or exposure to inappropriate material or people. The District is not responsible for the accuracy or quality of the information obtained through Internet access. The District will not be responsible for financial obligations arising through unauthorized or inappropriate use. It is impossible for the District to restrict access to all offensive and controversial materials. It is the responsibility of the students to abide by the policy to avoid such content.

## Copyright/Ownership

Copyrighted materials may not be placed on any service accessed via the Internet or any system connected to the District's system(s) and used in conjunction with District initiatives without permission from the holder of the copyright and materials must be licensed directly to the District. Only the owners or authorized individuals may upload or download copyrighted material to and from the district's systems. Unauthorized copyrighted materials will be removed upon notification.

## Privacy/Monitoring/Confidentiality

Users shall have no expectation of privacy when utilizing district technology or related services. At any time and without prior notice, the District reserves the right to monitor, inspect, copy, review and/or store any and all results of computers, network and/or Internet access and any and all information transmitted or received in connection with such usage. This includes, but is not limited to, information contained in online services provided by the District. All such information shall be and remain the property of the District. The creator of original works may retain specific rights to use as applicable under U.S. copyright law.

## Prohibited Practices

The use of technology for any purpose that violates the student code of conduct, board policies, rules or regulations regarding the use of technology in the district, building or classroom or any use which is outside the educational purpose is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to:

Theft, destruction of property; Purchasing goods or services; Bullying; Interfering with the normal functioning of computers, systems or networks; Accessing, modifying or deleting files/data that do not belong to you

Giving your username or password to any other student, or using the username or password of someone else to access any part of the system; Viewing, transmitting or downloading pornographic, obscene, vulgar and/or indecent materials

Sending or publishing offensive or harassing messages/content; Accessing dangerous information that, if acted upon, could cause damage or danger to others; Violating copyright laws and/or district policy on plagiarism

Recreational/non-educational use of electronic communication; "Hacking" and other illegal activities in an attempt to gain unauthorized access to restricted files, other computers/systems. Uploading any harmful form of programming, bypassing filters; installing any type of Server, aliasing/ spoofing, peer-to-peer networking or remote control software. Possession of any software tools designed to facilitate any of the above actions will also be considered an offense

Saving inappropriate files to any part of the system, including but not limited to music files, movies, video games, offensive images/files, programs which can be used for malicious purposes, any files for which you do not have a legal license, hobby or personal interest files, even if not offensive or inappropriate

Any file which is not needed for school purposes or a class assignment

## Consequences

Those who violate this Agreement and those failing to report violations shall be dealt with following established student discipline guidelines. The District also reserves the right to administer the appropriate disciplinary action in accordance with the "Student Code of Conduct" which includes but is not limited to detention, in school suspension, out of school suspension or expulsion. Any infractions that fall under the provisions of the Ohio and Federal Criminal Codes will be referred to the appropriate law enforcement agencies.

## Ban of Criminal and Illegal Acts

In addition to the rules and guidelines stated in this Agreement, the District prohibits the use of any technology or service in the commission of any criminal or illegal act or the preparation for, communication about or the cover up of such actions and will refer offenders to proper law enforcement agencies. The District also reserves the right to seek monetary and/or other damages resulting from any criminal or illegal act or violation of this Agreement.
